#### Staying COVID-Safe

Teams and coaches are encouraged to meet with your teams OUTSIDE the stadium before and after games, to minimise time indoors. We're reducing the number of people heading upstairs or meeting in groups for long periods, to keep everyone safer.

#### COVID-affected games

Cancellations of games due to players affected by Covid (or any other illness) are catered for under the current by-laws:

Juniors: teams may play with 4 players, and clubs have been reminded of this. We encourage clubs to use fill-in players where possible.

Seniors: teams may play with 4 players. Extra players can register at reception prior to the game.

Games cancelled due to illness are treated as a forfeit and not a washout; and teams forfeited against are encouraged to come in to train (stadium to be advised of this so that WBA can reserve the court for this purpose). Current government regulations seek to ensure community sport goes ahead as a priority and our by-laws seek to discourage forfeits where possible, to allow both teams to play.
