ENVIRONMENT	Limited or no spectators	Witnessed by a large number of spectators and/or adolescents	Witnessed by children
REMORSE	Genuine apology & remorse	Some remorse and/or partial apology	No remorse or apology
PRIOR CONDUCT	No prior misconduct of any sort	No prior behaviour of similar nature	Prior behaviour of similar nature
